We hope that your health is good and your level of optimism is not dropping too drastically.

Thank you so much for having kept us informed about your current situation and about the choices you made to keep going.

Of course, our last two letters in which we included recommendations and where we put on the table some elements to help you find the best option for your training are still relevant. However, the longer this goes on, the more the numbers of online days we suggested seem impossible to keep. We have been waiting to contact you, because the situation was so unstable that we did not know what better advice we could propose.

Now that we are again in a situation with so many obstacles, we cannot avoid the need to adapt and explore new ways in the foggy and misty days we are in. We fully understand that the continuation of your activity requires much more drastic adaptations than what we proposed during the summer.


There are two points in particular that we would like to approach:

- the number of online teaching days: for the moment, we leave that open to your understanding of your own situation, since each one is so specific. Considering the feedback we received, it is clear that a good interaction with the students is the key to finding an adequate solution to continue the training for the best.
- the possibility for the ED to teach more days. In most European countries live teaching is currently just not possible. That being the case, invited Trainers could teach online as easily as EDs. However, if it helps flexibility, it could be an option for the ED to teach a greater than usual number of days. But we think this should be considered as a solution of last recourse.

At this moment, it is of utmost importance to keep the contact between you and EuroTAB. Please give us in advance your planning for your training segments, between now and next spring, in terms of number of teaching days and hours online, with the name of the trainer in charge. If you have interesting feedback to tell us afterwards, of course we would be glad to hear it.
